

There were 1482 entries from 828 competitors. Jake Tamai from College Park Judo and Leo Hanada from College Park both took home a gold medal. On the International event – Zack, Kai Hanada, Jake Tamai and Leo Hanada brought home 3 silver medals. We appreciate all of the time and energy these judokas



took training hard to represent us on the national and international stage.

About the clinician: David McFall first took to the tatami at the Cranford Judo and Karate Center under the instruction Yonezuka-sensei. After moving to Japan in 2006, he has spent the past fifteen years training in Tokyo, primarily at the Kodokan. He developed an interest in kata, particularly Koshiki no Kata, while observing 10th-dan Daigo-sensei's study group, the Kudenkai, in the main dojo of the Kodokan. After a period of three months observing this group, he was invited to participate with and ultimately join the Kudenkai. Practicing twice a week for over ten years, he has performed the Koshiki no Kata literally hundreds of times under Daigo-sensei. In addition to practicing the Koshiki no Kata, he attended monthly lectures by Daigo-sensei focused on the theory, practice and history of the Koshiki no Kata. He is one of only four non-Japanese who has been awarded (jyukutatsu) "Mastery of the technique" grading for Koshiki no Kata. In addition to kata training, he has done commentary for the International Judo Federation for four world championships as well as the 2016 Rio Olympics and Paralympic Games.



Koshiki no Kata (*Form of the antique things*) is a Judo kata of 21 prearranged techniques. The set of forms is antique and were intended for "Kumiuchi", the grappling of armored warriors in the feudal ages. As such, the kata is to be performed with both partners imagining that they are clad in armor. Links to videos: Koshiki no kata performed by N. 

Sensei Diane Jackson is a Rokudan from Hui-O-Judo in Beltsville, MD. She was a USA World team member for 8 World Kata Championships, Pan-American and National Champion in multiple katas, a Pan-American kata judge, and a National referee.



A tribute to John Morrison

Shufu Judo Yudanshakai is sad to announce the passing of Sensei John Morrison on Saturday, March 12, 2022. John (85 years old) was predeceased by his wife, Betty Jane. He is survived by his son Russell and wife Cyndee Morrisson, 4 grandchildren and 5 great



grandchildren. A graveside service was held on March 28th at 11am at the Forest Hills Memorial Park. He served his country in the Marine Reserves and enjoyed a career as a supervisor with AT&T. He enjoyed playing the bagpipes and gardening. John was active in judo in many different roles, but his main love and devotion was to his family.



In Shufu Yudanshakai, we have already lost many judo greats of his generation including Kenzo Uyneo, Don Drager, Prof.Ishikawa, Tim Dalton, Ken Tamai, Dr Koiwai, John Anderson, Jimmy Takemori and many others. Each of these are now watching over us to see how we will continue the judo traditions. They helped to build our judo community and set the foundation for who we are. I thought about how I could sum up and celebrate John's life. While there are so many stories that I could share with you from many years of judo together, each person reading this may have many memories and stories that you hold in your heart. Each may have known a different version or perspective of John. Each one of you he touched is part of his legacy and is a continuation of John's life.

John Morrisson started judo in the early 1950's. He was a member of several other JBBF and USJF clubs including Cranford Judo in Cranford, NJ under sensei Yoshisada Yoneska and Ishikawa Dojo in Philadelphia PA under Professor Ishikawa. He was a life member of the United States Judo Federation. He served as vice president and president of Shufu Judo Yudanshakai for 12 years and was a delegate at many national meetings. He helped to revise the USJF rank



system. He was a member of the Shufu Judo Yudanshakai Board of Examiners, Chairman

of the Virginia Judo Inc Promotion Board, a national referee. He was a Shichidan (7th degree black belt) in judo. He joined the Arlington Judo Club in 1998 and served as their technical advisor.

Judo is the "gentle way". John was a quiet, gentle, caring presence. He helped to lead and guide us. In judo, one of our principles is "Jita Kyoei" which means mutual welfare and benefit. We learn from and help each other to grow into the best person we can be. Judo teaches us to continually improve ourselves and to contribute to society in a positive way. John embodied these parts of judo. He was happy to give his time as a friend, a teacher, a referee, a mentor, or whatever capacity he was asked to be. He was happy to share is love of judo with others. He never sought spotlight or recognition.



There are certain people who come into your life and leave an indelible mark on you. He was one of those people, to me and to many others he touched. We



celebrate his life and the gift of the time each of us got to spend with him. Time is the greatest gift anyone can give. Money cannot buy time. Our time is precious, so who we share it with and how much we share with other makes a difference. Each person has enjoyed different memories of their time with John. He left a part of himself in each one of us. We do not mourn the loss of John, rather, we thank God that such a man lived. Please take a moment and reflect on the life and joy that John has brought to each one of us. He instilled a part of himself in each of us. He leaves a legacy for each one of us. We will love him always and cherish the gift of time we were able to spend with him.

The Arlington Judo Club (AJC) was founded in 1996 by Sensei Michael Landstreet who is the current Head Instructor. Over the years the AJC has grown and at this time has a membership of over 70 students. As a nationally recognized club the AJC is officially registered and affiliated with the United States Judo Federation, **Shufu Judo Yudanshakai**, United States Judo, Inc. (USA Judo), and Virginia Judo Inc. Traditional Kodokan Judo is taught to include its customs and ways. Mutual respect and manners are part of the dojo practice. The AJC has a quality staff that is composed of highly respected



black belts who are actively involved both nationally and internationally in Judo. As an involved club, the AJC hosts State and Regional tournaments from time to time. We welcome all judoka to our club who wish to improve in both mind and body. Visitors are welcome but all participants must be current members of either USA Judo, USJF, or USJA and sign the standard waiver to participate. The Head Instructor can assist you with your national membership if needed. Our club membership is composed of both male and female, ages 5 to adult. Since 1996 the AJC has produced a number of medalists at many tournaments in both kata and shiai. At our club we strive to learn new techniques and to improve, coupled with the philosophy of having a fun but safe practice in the dojo.

Head Instructor. Mr. Landstreet has been involved in Judo for approximately 50 years. His certifications include being an International Coach, National Referee, and Master Teacher. He is the current President of Virginia Judo Inc., and is also actively involved with Shufu Judo Yudanshakai serving as current Chairman of Teacher Certification and as a member of the Board of Examiners. In 2005 he was the Tournament Director for the USA Judo Senior National Championships. With the assistance of helpful members of the Arlington Judo Club he continues to teach, coach, referee, run selected State and Regional level tournaments, and strive to make improvements within the dojo.

Winston enjoys sharing his knowledge, experience and genuine enthusiasm for Judo with others. Naturally both of his sons are active competitors in Judo. His wife, Kim, also assists the club behind the scenes from time to time.

Gaiv Tata, Sensei, Yodan (4th Degree Black Belt)
